# is a Disciplinary?

A disciplinary is something you will get if you have broken the University Codes of Conduct. It could either be Academic or Non-Academic, depending on what the disciplinary is given to you for.

You'll know you have a disciplinary if you get an email telling you so - it will tell you what kind of disciplinary you have.

You will have to provide a statement to the Clerk at least 2 days before the hearing.

## **Process Outline**

#### Meeting with SCD

You <u>may</u> have a meeting with the Student Conduct Department to discuss your situation before the hearing.

We can help by attending this meeting with you and explaining the format of the meeting.

#### **Write Your Statement**

You will have to write a statement to make your case. This statement will be considered in the panel meeting.

We can help by giving you advice and support when writing your statement and gathering evidence.

#### **Outcome**

The panel will make a decision based on your statement and the evidence. You may be given a date and time to attend a hearing.

> We can attend the meeting as either moral support or a representative.

## Possible Outcomes

An academic disciplinary could lead to:

- Cancellation of assessment
- Discontinuation of studies

# Investigation by SCD

The incident will be investigated by the Student Conduct Department.

We can help by attending any meetings with you and explaining the format of the meeting.

# Write Your Statement

If the issue is taken further, you will have to write a statement to make your case. This statement will be considered in the panel meeting.

We can help by giving you advice and support when writing your statement and gathering evidence.

#### **Outcomes**

The panel will make a decision based on your statement and the evidence. You may be required to attend every meeting and hearing, or to send a representative.

We can attend the meeting as either moral support or a representative.

## Possible Outcomes

A non-academic disciplinary could lead to:

- Verbal or Written Reprimand
- (stays on your record until you graduate)
- Exclusion (for no more than 28 days)
- Suspension of Studies
- · Compensation of damages (if required)
- Expulsion (with no allowance for re-admittance)
